Kentucky Waves
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Definitions:

SKY (Swim Kentucky) is the Masters *club* you belong to. SKY is registered with United States Masters Swimming Inc.

The group you work out with is a *team*. The team is registered with Kentucky Masters Swimming, which is a division of USMS Inc.

Meets sanctioned in Kentucky with more than 10 events are scored by *team*. Mini-meets (meets with fewer than 10 events) are scored as SKY.

All meet results go to the national records chair as SKY.

You are listed in the national database as being a member of SKY.

On entry forms for Kentucky sanctioned meets, indicate SKY/team.

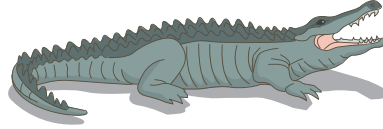

Ninety-five swimmers hit the water in Bowling Green on January 29, 2005! This was the largest meet the Western Kentucky Green Gators have hosted since the inception of the meet in the late 1980s. Nine clubs were represented from five states: Kentucky, Indiana, Illinois, Alabama and Tennessee. The Kentucky club, SKY, was well represented by seven of the 13 teams that make up SKY. These



teams are located in several cities throughout the commonwealth, and are scored separately in Kentucky sanctioned meets.

Overall club winners were Middle Tennessee Swim Club of Hendersonville, Tenn., coached by Ron Chiasta, which won the large club trophy. Another new club, Vanderbilt Masters, with six swimmers, took home the small club trophy. Congratulations to the trophy winners—we hope to see you next year! 🏆

Registration Reminders

Meet Entries. To help your registrar, Top 10 chair, meet directors, and clerks of course, remember to sign all meet entries with the exact same name that is on your USMS card—if your card says "Michael," do *not* sign "Mike"!

Meet Identification. This is vital for the USMS registration administrator and Records and Tabulation Committee chair, along with our Kentucky registrar, Top 10 chair, and meet directors. On each meet entry, identify yourself as SKY/team. First because you are a member of Swim Kentucky Masters (SKY), the club registered with United States Masters Swimming, and second because you are a member of a Kentucky team or workout group, registered with Kentucky Masters Swimming. SKY swimmers not affiliated with a team are SKY/INDE (independent).

USMS Card. If you happen to misplace or lose your card, please contact the registrar immediately. There is a \$1 charge to replace the card and mail it to you. Here's a good idea: make copies of your USMS card!

Change of Address. Please send promptly to the registrar so that the Kentucky and national databases will be updated, and *USMS Swimmer* magazine and renewal forms can be sent to your new address.

30-Day Tryout Form. This form allows a swimmer to participate in a structured workout only. To compete in a sanctioned meet, you must be a registered member of USMS, by completing the registration form and paying the appropriate dues. 🏊

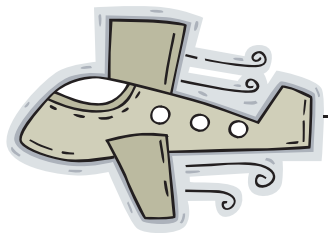
